Prior to the commencement of the meeting the Chairman invited Louise Davidson a Regional Development Manager for the Rural Housing Association to address the meeting on the subject of affordable housing. She spoke in general about the problems in North Somerset and more particularly of the lack of affordable housing in Bleadon. To afford to purchase the cheapest house currently for sale in Bleadon would require an annual salary of £60,000. When setting this against the average salary of £27,000 in North Somerset it clearly showed how difficult it was for a first time buyer to secure a home in the village. Some of the statistics she mentioned according to the last census was that there were some 400 people in the 18/29 age range and at the other end of the scale 1300 in the 60/85 age range. Whilst there were some 110 properties currently in rented ownership she was of the opinion that there still was not sufficient affordable properties available in the village. She then went on to explain how villages similar to Bleadon could secure the right mix of houses that could be afforded by local residents. At the conclusion of her presentation a number of questions were posed. She then retired from the meeting.
