## **District Councillor Michael Solomon**

He reported on the discussions that he and Councillor Terry Porter had with various North Somerset Officers with reference to the recent fatal accident on the A370 junction. He also referred to the many conversations had with members of the Parish Council. His comments centred on the various options that were being put forward by North Somerset Highways. He indicated that just one set of lights and associated works would cost in the region of £70,000. After being asked a number of questions and noting the observation proffered by members he agreed that they would be taking into consideration when moving forward with North Somerset Council.

Councillor Clarke raised two points of order in connection with the co-option of Mr D Sharman. She informed members that past Minutes had not recorded his resignation so technically he had not resigned but had been absent for more than the allowed six months. On checking NSC legal notices to see if they had been informed of his resignation the notices of J Richardson K Hemmingway and D Sharman were all noted in January but signed by NB who had left in December. She also pointed out that we had bypassed the requirements as listed in our Co-option Policy.

Councillor Clarke assured Members that this was not a personal issue but a wish to follow our agreed policies and asked that this be Minuted.

Members chose to proceed with the co-options with Cllr. Scarisbrick noting that we had not followed our procedures and policies and that we should make sure we follow them in future.

The Chairman noted the comments and in response stated that she could well understand the omission from the Minutes of such information given the departure of the then Clerk and that those facts i.e. omissions had not been raised at any subsequent meeting when approval of the minutes were sought.

<u>Addendum</u> The Clerk indicated subsequently on checking with North Somerset that the correct procedures regarding the notification of the resignations had been appropriately recorded irrespective of the omission in the Council's Minutes.
