#### Project Description and Planning

Zone Three – End of Chestnut lane, Allotments, start of Footpath, Water Cupboard, Field opposite Cottages

Zone Four – Edges of Rhyne – all of them

Zone Five - Entrance to Hall, Park and Wishing Well #

Zone Six – Bridge road and Escape area

Zone Seven - Church, Bus Stop and Pub

Zone Eight – Birch Avenue and the Veale



Zone Nine – Celtic way, Hill top and Bus Stop

- Cakes and refreshments


The festival will start at 10.00 and finish at 2.00pm


## Judging Day Plan – 8th of July
