FROM YOUR DISTRICT COUNCILLOR

Many people will now know that Wessex Water have started work on the water treatment works to be built on the Bleadon levels. However, I expect it will come as a surprise that building work will take up to four years! This is due to additional work that is in the 'pipeline'. However, some progress has been made, in that some of the proposed overhead cables will now be buried, approximately 1200 metres of cabling on the land owned by Wessex Water. Where the cable leaves the site in the Uphill direction (over the railway) will still be overhead. I would like to thank those villagers who wrote to SWEB about the overhead cables. This was mentioned by SWEB at a meeting I had with them, which proves that public pressure can have an effect.

Wessex water have submitted a revised planning application in respect of one of the lagoons which form part of the plant. This is required because the National Rivers Authority (N.R.A.) have decided to incorporate the earth mound, known as a bund, into the sea defences: the lagoon is now planned to be closer to Uphill and of a different shape. Finally on the Wessex Water situation, they have offered to issue a quarterly bulletin, which I hope will be published in the Bleadon Village News.

I have received the last Avon Area Transport Policies & Programme Submission (T.P.P.), which includes a section on 'Villages on Roads Between Main Urban Areas', which identifies Bleadon as a candidate for speed reducing measures. This means we have a chance that the proposed speed limits for the village and the A370 may be carried out by North Somerset in the financial year 1996/97. You can rest assured that this will be high on my action list when the budget for highways is set early in the new year.

TRAFFIC IN BLEADON

At its November meeting the Parish Council decided to request from the Highway Authority (at present Avon, from next April North Somerset) the following measures :

- 1. A 30 mph speed limit throughout the village, ie; Bleadon Road, Bridge Road, Celtic Way, Coronation Road and Shiplate Road to the top of The Veale.
- 2. A 40 mph speed limit on the A370 for its whole length within the Parish.
- 3. Traffic islands on the A370 at the Bridge Road/Bridgwater/Bleadon Mill junctions.
- 4. A ban on heavy vehicles using Celtic Way, Coronation Road and Shiplate Road (except for access).

The idea of a one-way system at the junction of Bleadon Road and Bridgwater Road was rejected.

THEIR CUP RUNNETH OVER

Customers of the Queens Arms who manage to lift their gaze above the barrels at the back of the bar will notice a large new item of silverware. This prestigious looking trophy is the "Whitbread's" 7-a-side U.K. Open cup, won last month by the Queens Arms team after battling through six rounds. The entry of 63 teams covered an area from Cornwall to Gloucestershire, so the good name of Bleadon has been spread pretty widely.



VILLAGE RECREATION AREA

Because of the circular following the public meeting on the subject in September, more or less the whole village knows that the field alongside Bridge Road went to auction an October 3rd. The appeal for donations towards the purchase of the field brought in $\pounds4,185$, which has of course been returned to the donors.

In parallel with this effort a number of residents clubbed together on a loan basis and went to auction in partnership with the Weston Angling Club, who wanted the other field contained in the lot. Between us we were prepared to go to £38,000 for the 16 acres but we were almost instantly left behind in the bidding, which ended at £51,500 pounds. The purchasers are the Sanders Pension fund, who obviously see it as an investment because that is a pension fund's raison d'être. To those who visualise a housing estate on the site in a couple of years I can only say that in my opinion no development will be allowed there for much longer than that. Eventually there may well be a trade-off — recreation land in exchange for development next door — but only when there is much greater pressure for development over the whole district

BLEADON CORONATION HALL

At the time of writing we have just held our Christmas Coffee Morning. This was very well supported and everyone present seemed to thoroughly enjoy the very sociable atmosphere, not least the coffee and mince pies. Our provisional figures indicate a net contribution to hall funds of £178. Many thanks to all those people who supported us.

We have been having more than our share of problems with the hall heating. Faults, where present, have been rectified but we are still troubled by some hall users who do not read the instruction notices when turning the heaters off. Each heater has a rotary switch to adjust the heat. This is the only control that should be used to turn off the heaters. I would appeal to all users not to press any other buttons on the control panels. If these are used they can extinguish the pilot flame which means that subsequent users may not be able to use the heaters — not a comforting thought now that spells of cold weather are with us.

Those of you who have recently walked through the public car park by the hall will have noticed that work on the extension has commenced. The footings have been dug out and the concrete foundations laid. The weather has not been kind to us since the work began and this slowed things down. We are relying on a great deal of voluntary assistance

> with the construction. Contributions by way of construction materials would also be most welcome. Our finances, including grant aid, are not sufficient to support the cost of using contractors for all of the work. Professional persons will be used for roofing, plumbing, heating and electrical work. We still hope to see the scouts, guides, cubs and brownies meeting in this new facility around the middle of next year.

On behalf of the Management Committee I wish all our readers and especially our hall users, a very Merry Christmas and a happy and successful New Year.

OUR NEW LOCAL AUTHORITY


It will not be long before Avon ceases to exist and for us its functions will be taken over by North Somerset (ie. Woodspring by another name). These include education, highways and youth service.






