Thank you for responding to my letter about local planning. The post on my website you're referring to in your email was published in January 2015, but the decision didn't come until 2016 — to give us almost £1,000,000 in funding to create a housing zone on brownfield land. Secondly, I'm happy to confirm that I'm not suggesting high-rise housing should be any taller than existing town centre buildings – e.g. Sovereign Centre or Weston College (probably even shorter, such as the height of local trees). In my view, anything taller would need careful planning debate and decisions.
