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About the active travel fund

Active travel in North Somerset is changing. Watch this space to find out how you can get involved in shaping the future of walking and cycling in your area.

The pandemic has changed the way we think about transport. As part of the Government's Active Travel Fund (ATF), the council wants to encourage walking and cycling as a long-term method for commuting. We are also looking to address the current capacity constraints on public transport.

North Somerset Council have been successful in securing Department for Transport ATF funding. This funding will allow us to develop a range of new schemes to meet the below goals:

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The first phase of work took place in summer 2020. It included a wide range of temporary measures that provided additional space for social distancing and cycling. The extra space also helped businesses to stay open, or to provide outside seating,

Phase two

After the successful delivery of phase one, we have now been allocated £473,750 to develop phase two.
