

BLEADON VILLAGE NEWS

Dear Parishioner.

13th March 1993.

In the last issue of the "Bleadon Village News", I reported briefly on the allegations, made by Mr. & Mrs. Corder, that Bleadon Parish Council is illegal. In this issue I intend to deal with the outcome of this dispute, its cost and effect upon the Parish Precept.

Over the past months Mr. & Mrs. Corder have made numerous complaints to the Auditors and other Authorities about the Council. Some complaints were made to The Department of Environment and to the Audit Commission itself. Despite receiving letters from a number of sources which stated that Bleadon Parish Council was in fact legally constituted, the complaints continued. These complaints were of a repetitive nature on almost every occasion. The Auditors warned them of the escalating cost of the audit due to the continual complaints but this warning appears to have been ignored. I spoke with the Auditor in early January and he informed me that the costs, to that date, were some £3000. Mr. & Mrs. Corder have written at least two more letters since that time, which has resulted in further legal and audit costs. These charges will be passed on to the Council in due course, the total cost of Audit will therefore be higher than the £3000 quoted above. A sum of this size is a lot of money for a small Parish Council to find.

I am delighted to report that I received the completed Certificate of Audit in yesterday's mail. The Auditor has completed the audit and states: "the objection is an abuse of the audit process and fails at the outset". The objections by Mr. & Mrs. Corder have been dismissed, but they do have the right of appeal to the High Court.

I am sorry to say that it is the Electors of the Parish who have to bear the cost of these complaints, so this unnecessary expenditure has to be included in the precept for the next financial year. Your Parish Council has tried to keep the cost as low as possible and a number of items on the precept have been eliminated or reduced. We are committed to improve the street lighting in our Village and three new lights will soon be in place. However in an attempt to reduce the precept there is no provision for any more lights in the year 1993/94, which saved £1000. The Council usually gives a £1000 grant to the Hall Management Committee to help with repairs and decoration, but this grant has been reduced by 50% next year. We have made no provision this year for the Renewal of Stiles in our Parish and we have cut out the Recreational Fee. These two items save a further £200, making a total saving of £1700.

After making these savings each elector, on average, will pay a Parish Precept ammounting to £13.83 per head. This equates to an increase of £3.89 per elector. I apologise for this 39% increase on your precept which is entirely due to the complaints made to the Auditors by Mr. & Mrs. Corder, and the Parish Council is legally obliged to pay their costs. The Annual Parish Meeting will be held on Monday 26th. April and I look forward to seeing you at the Coronation Hall and hearing your comments and suggestions.

Neither post is tremendously time-consuming or mentally demanding but both are vital ingredients in the Hall's continuing success. AVON LOCAL COUNCILS ASSOCIATION

Your Parish Council is a member of the above. The association offers a collective voice that tries to influence other authorities and organisations. It has representatives on various liaison committees. The following few items have been abstracted from recent reports from such committees.

British Telecom - B.T. Has taken to heart the 'WHICH' report of last October which said that they were "significantly worse than any other public utility" on handling complaints. B.T. has introduced a Freephone number for customers to call when dissatisfied with the handling of any complaint. The number is 0800 545 458. Local dialling numbers in Bristol were due to be withdrawn in February. Henceforth national dialling numbers will be needed.

Post Office - The Post Office have also taken on board the 'WHICH' criticisms of poor counter-service. If you have cause to complain in future you may either obtain an appropriate form from your local office or you can write to the Customer Service Manager at your local District Office. You can also contact the Post Office Advisory Committee on Freephone 0800 282 329.

Bristol AirPort - The public inquiry into the proposed new terminal building at Lulsgate is scheduled for Ilth May 1993. In the six months from April to September 1992 the passenger movements at Lulsgate increased by about 40% over the same period in 1991.

Police Liaison Committee - This committee reports that telephone calls to local police stations will only be answered during normal office hours. This will only be done if the telephone is manned by a civilian. This, of course does not affect 999 calls which are now routed to Taunton.

Avon Traveline - A telephone enquiry service covering all public transport services in Avon is available on 0272 557013.

Libraries - It has been acknowledged that Public Pressure caused Avon County Council to withdraw its plans to close some libraries. Reduced hours have been introduced. There is a lesson to learn from this. It does pay dividends if individual members of the public make known their views, on any relevant issue, direct to the appropriate authority. Such views add greatly to any similarly expressed by your Parish Council and may well have even more effect.


Royal British Legion. Lympsham & Bleadon. Men's & Women's Section.


