Dear Parishioner.

You may have seen the recent article in the local press, which reported on the massive Audit Bill received by this Council for the year 1991/92. The bill was in excess of £5200, the major part caused by the complaints made by Mr & Mrs Corder, In fact these complaints cost over £5100 and there is no way that the Parish Council can obtain reimbursement We have been forced to use reserves to cover this cost. These reserves were intended to cover future legal fees for a problem which was inherited by this Council. In his final letter to Mr & Mrs Corder the Auditor, after taking legal advice, stated that "the complaints were an abuse of the audit process and were dismissed". I am very pleased to inform you that the "Cordergate Affair" is over, but it still leaves us with a problem. The Council has to recover the monies used from its reserves, and will have to do this in next years precept. I am sorry, but we have no alternative. I am sorry to inform you that Mrs Jill Bowmer recently tendered her resignation as a Parish Councillor, Jill was a very hard working and efficient member of the Council, always willing to undertake any and every task. Jill will be very difficult to replace and I wish to take this opportunity to thank her, for all her efforts and for her support. We will be Coopting a new member in the near future, hopefully in time to start at our next meeting on Ilth October.

The good news is that the Honda pylon sign has been removed at long last. What a difference it has made to the road junction by the Catherine's Inn, a real improvement in road safety. Many people worked very hard to obtain this result, but a special thanks is due to the following: District Cllr. Alan Kerr, Parish Councillors Jill Bowmer and Eric Benn. A special vote of thanks must go to Mr Dennis Coombe of Purn Way. Dennis suggested, organised and participated in the Road Traffic Census which was so important in our representations to the Planning Officers. The garage has now obtained the Fiat franchise, we will be watching the new signs very closely indeed. A new extension is planned for the Coronation Hall. This is a joint venture between the Hall Management Committee and the Guides, Scouts, Cubs and Brownies- It is a very exciting prospect and enjoys the unanimous backing of the Parish Council. It was the Council which originally suggested the joint venture. The extended building will be of enormous benefit to all who use it, and work should commence in the near future. I will keep you informed of developments in the next Newsletter.

The next Parish Council Meeting will be held on Monday 11th October in the Coronation Hall, and we would like to see you there.



NOT SO MUCH A BUSINESS - MORE A WAY OF LIFE

Concern about the future of the Post Office in Bleadon has been expressed by several residents this summer, following the publicity about pensions being paid direct into banks or building society accounts, I was able to assure them that barring enormous changes in rules and ownership Bleadon should retain its Post Office for several years at least, but it might help at this stage to clarify the situation for those residents who are interested.

To begin with, sub-postmasters are NOT salaried employees of the Post Office. They are self-employed people who have invested their capital in a business which includes a contract with the Post Office and their remuneration is directly related to their turnover. In village offices this is not usually enough to live on, so a significant turnover in the rest of the business is essential.

The number of village offices is declining but not because the Post Office is deliberately shutting them. In many cases the owners let the business run down as they approach retirement, to the extent that it becomes unsaleable and the property reverts to a private residence. We could take the same path and would no doubt obtain a very good price for the house but that would be a very selfish approach. Once a village's sole shop/post office has shut down it is virtually impossible to restart from scratch in different premises. Therefore, I shall do my level best to ensure that when I finally hang up my datestamp, this Post Office will be a good BUSINESS proposition to potential purchasers. After that it will be up to my successor.

BONFIRES


