For those of you not aware, BNG is an approach to development that aims to leave the natural environment in a measurably better state than it was beforehand. Although the date has yet to be confirmed, legislation surrounding BNG will become mandatory in the UK in early 2024.

After this date, developers will be required to achieve at least 10% Biodiversity Net Gain on all new developments - so by law their development must deliver a net positive for the local environment, for example by creating new habitats and green spaces. Whilst some developers will find this on-site, others will need to find external sites to deliver these requirements.

YOUR land could be what they are looking for. This could help fund the ongoing management of a site to the tune of £1,800 per hectare per year for 30 years – helping to replace the loss of the existing Basic Payment Scheme (BPS). In England alone, it's estimated that the new scheme could generate £200m a year for offsite habitat creation.

In this new Introductory webinar, we'll be helping you break through the jargon, explaining what BNG is, how it might affect you, and how supporting wildlife on your land can actually boost your income.


