19/1107 RECEIVE MOTION FROM CLLR N. BARTON

"That this Council resolves-

- 1)To declare Clevedon a Frack Free zone.
- 2)To oppose unconventional onshore and offshore oil and gas exploration and development activities on any land that we own or have an interest in.
- 3) Not to invest in any companies which are involved in fracking, including other methods of unconventional onshore or offshore oil and gas production.
- 4)To call on North Somerset District Council to pass similar motions and to put planning policies in place to implement a presumption against all applications for unconventional oil and gas exploration and production in North Somerset, including fracking, following the example of the ten borough councils in Greater Manchester and the new draft London Plan 5)To write to the MP for Clevedon to convey the concerns of Clevedon Town Council, in this matter.
- 6)To convey our opposition to fracking, and to urge our MP to lobby Government to ban unconventional onshore oil and gas development permanently and to request that he writes back indicating whether he is supporting Clevedon Town Council in this matter.

Cllr Barton presented the motion and explained the reasoning behind it, and that one of the licences covers a small area of Clevedon. The motion was seconded by Cllr Young.

Members discussed at length the issue of fracking, renewable energy and the disputed 'facts' around fracking. It was noted that there was a lot of contradictory evidence concerning the effect fracking has on the environment, health and ground stability. There was a sub discussion whether this was a politically motivated motion.

Proposed, seconded and agreed to amend the above motion at points 1 and 3 to read

- 1)To declare our opposition to any fracking in Clevedon.
- 3) Not knowingly to invest in any companies which are involved in fracking, including other methods of unconventional onshore or offshore oil and gas production.

Proposed seconded and **RESOLVED by 9 votes to 3 with 1 abstention** to **AGREE** the motion as amended.
