UK Armed Forces personnel have played a key role in the country's response to the coronavirus pandemic.


During the peak of the military's response, 20,000 troops were at readiness, with more than 4,000 of them deployed at any one time.

Here is what the British military has been doing in response to the COVID-19 outbreak.

Nightingale Hospitals

A major focus of the military's work has been on assisting the NHS.

Personnel helped to set up Nightingale hospitals around the country, which provided additional care capacity for coronavirus patients.



- The British Army also helped <u>convert Glasgow's SEC Centre into a</u>
 <u>temporary NHS hospital (https://www.forces.net/news/coronavirus-army-support-glasgow-secs-conversion-temporary-hospital)</u> and to build a <u>field hospital at the Principality Stadium in Cardiff.</u>

- Army veteran Captain Sir Tom Moore, who <u>raised more than £32m</u>

Mobile testing

- Mobile coronavirus testing units <u>have been operating across the UK</u>
 (https://www.forces.net/news/coronavirus-forces-man-new-mobile-testing-units-across-uk), including sites in <u>Gloucestershire</u>
 (https://www.forces.net/news/coronavirus-royal-marines-run-mobile-testing-centres-cornwall). The vast majority of the facilities were staffed by the military, but operations of England's sites https://www.forces.net/news/armed-forces-hand-over-operations-englands-mobile-testing-units).
- In Scotland and Wales, the military are expected to continue to run the mobile units until the end of the summer.
- The Armed Forces have conducted more than 700,000 tests at UK sites since April. More than 2,700 service personnel have run 218 pop-up units since the programme began.
- The Defence Secretary <u>praised military personnel for their "ingenuity and determination" (https://www.forces.net/news/ingenuity-and-determination-military-key-92-testing-units-supplied-week)</u> after getting 92 mobile testing sites ready in the space of just a week.
- The Health Secretary thanked the "best of the best" in the British military (https://www.forces.net/news/coronavirus-military-praised-government-hits-daily-test-target) as he confirmed the Government had met its target of 100,000 coronavirus tests per day.

Supporting ambulance services

- Nearly 400 Armed Forces personnel from the COVID Support Force were <u>mobilised to support ambulance services</u> (<u>https://www.forces.net/news/coronavirus-armed-forces-personnel-support-ambulance-services</u>) across the country.
- Members of the British Army, the Royal Air Force and the Royal Navy have <u>supported NHS ambulance services</u> (<u>https://www.forces.net/news/coronavirus-norfolk-based-soldiers-given-ambulance-training</u>).
- Elsewhere, more than 100 tri-service personnel were <u>trained to drive oxygen</u> <u>tankers (https://www.forces.net/news/coronavirus-military-personnel-train-drive-oxygen-tankers-lockdown-begins)</u> in support of the NHS, if required.

Battling coronavirus in the lab

- When the coronavirus pandemic began, defence scientists were tasked (https://www.forces.net/news/porton-down-assist-coronavirus-<u>response</u>) with helping with the crisis, including finding out more about COVID-19 and ways to stop its spread. Staff at the Defence Science and Technology Laboratory (DSTL), Porton Down have been helping working to reduce the spread of the coronavirus.
- We were given <u>special access inside the DSTL in Wiltshire</u> (https://www.forces.net/news/inside-defence-laboratories-porton-downcombatting-covid-19) to learn more about the work of scientists there during the coronavirus crisis.

Training

- · Royal Marines underwent specialist training to help the fight against COVID-19, getting them ready to deploy across the south-west of England to support frontline workers.
- Troops from 247 Gurkha Signal Squadron, part of 16th Signal Regiment spent 10 days training with pharmacists on how to conduct COVID-19 testing at Edgbaston Cricket Ground in Birmingham.
- Similar programmes also took place in Manchester and Glasgow.

Delivery of PPE

- Regular and reservist personnel, from all three services, have helped to distribute and deliver <u>personal protective equipment (PPE) to frontline NHS</u> staff (https://www.forces.net/news/army-deliver-protective-equipmentfrontline-nhs-workers). The PPE includes items such as masks, safety glasses, gloves, aprons and protective suits.
- The British Army teamed up with eBay (https://www.forces.net/news/coronavirus-army-work-ebay-help-nhsorder-ppe) to help healthcare workers find and order free PPE.
- Alongside distributing supplies to medical personnel during the pandemic, the military has been 3D printing PPE components. (https://www.forces.net/news/military-support-nhs-3d-printing-ppe) Engineers from the Royal Navy, Royal Air Force and the Army began producing the components following an appeal from 3DCrowd UK, a volunteer organisation crowdsourcing 3D printer owners to help produce protective equipment.

Increasing medical capacity

- Military medics could be brought in to assist the NHS (https://www.forces.net/news/coronavirus-military-medics-could-help-nhs-<u>if-second-wave-strikes</u>) if there is a second spike in coronavirus cases in the winter.
- Two RAF aircraft normally used to transport Government ministers and VIPs were reconfigured in record time (https://www.forces.net/news/coronavirus-raf-aircraft-reconfiguredtransport-covid-19-patients) to help in the fight against coronavirus. The BAe 146s were specially adapted as medical evacuation planes for critically ill COVID-19 patients.
- The Ministry of Defence (MOD) set aside "dozens" of specialist military planners to support public services, authorities and emergency services on a local level.
- A group of MPs have voiced concern, however, over whether the Government has "made full use" of experts (https://www.forces.net/news/coronavirus-mps-question-if-governmentmade-full-use-military-experts), including those in the Armed Forces.

Tackling fake news

- The Ministry of Defence <u>sent a team (https://www.forces.net/news/mod-team-tackle-coronavirus-fake-news-and-scams)</u> to support the Cabinet Office in tackling online misinformation part of the COVID Support Force effort in bolstering the UK's coronavirus defences.
- In addition, two experts from the British Army joined a NATO team set up to combat disinformation.

Evacuation, transportation and repatriation

- The Aviation Task Force has provided <u>a dedicated helicopter capability</u> <u>across the UK's response to COVID-19</u>
 (https://www.forces.net/news/aviation-task-force-military-helicopters-responding-corona) British Army, Royal Air Force and Royal Navy aircraft operating 24 hours of the day.
- Joint Helicopter Command, an aircraft force comprising all three services, was put on standby to be used to reach "isolated communities that may not be able to obtain urgent medical care", the MOD said.
- The military has also conducted repatriation flights, including <u>bringing</u> <u>back British holidaymakers who were stranded</u>
 (https://www.forces.net/news/raf-assist-repatriation-flight-british-citizens-cuba) on a cruise ship in Cuba.

Northern Ireland

- A patient <u>was flown by the RAF from Northern Ireland to England</u>
 (<u>https://www.forces.net/news/coronavirus-raf-flies-patient-northern-ireland-england-treatment</u>) for treatment for COVID-19-related issues. An MOD spokesperson said the transfer marked the fourth time the RAF assisted Northern Ireland's department of health by transferring a patient during the coronavirus pandemic.
- In mid-May, it was announced that Northern Ireland's Nightingale hospital for treating COVID-19 patients was to be temporarily stood down. Stormont Health Minister, Robin Swann said the Belfast City Hospital tower block facility treated 30 people in intensive care beds at the height of the first wave of virus infection.
- A British Army base in County Down was chosen to be used as a temporary mortuary for victims of COVID-19 (https://www.forces.net/news/coronavirus-army-base-set-be-usedtemporary-mortuary).

Gibraltar

- Around 175 British personnel have assisted Gibraltar's government with the
 delivery of food and medicine to local residents. Medical supplies and
 military equipment arrived into RAF Gibraltar to boost the Rock's
 coronavirus response.
- Royal Gibraltar Regiment and MOD Gibraltar personnel worked together to help others during the COVID-19 crisis.
