PLANNING APPEAL INQUIRY – APP/D0121/W/18/3211789

Bleadon Parish Council is strongly opposed to the proposed development of 200+ homes on 'Land off Bleadon Road' and has presented a statement and documentation evidencing this.

Below is a suggested route for the Inspector to travel in order to witness the traffic difficulties that exist already. The most appropriate times are around 8:30am and 4.30pm

Travel down Celtic Way from Bleadon Hill, turn left on to Bridge Road, past Marshalls quarry, turn right on to A370, then turn right on to Bleadon Road.

Follow Bleadon Road through the village, follow Shiplate Road towards Loxton. Then **EITHER** turn right at White House Lane, turn left at Edingworth, turn right on to A38, turn right at the roundabout on to the A370, then turn right into Bleadon Mill. To return to Weston-super-Mare turn right out of Bleadon Mill on to the A370.

OR continue to Loxton, turn right at Loxton and follow the road all the way to Cross, turn right on to the A38, turn right at the roundabout on to the A370, then turn right into Bleadon Mill. To return to Weston-super-Mare turn right out of Bleadon Mill on to the A370.

In addition, the following viewpoints are considered key to demonstrating the nature of Bleadon as a tucked in village in a rural landscape.

Purn Lane, where the public footpath onto Purn Hill begins.

Celtic Way, where the West Mendip Way crosses the road.

Roman Road view point.
