Planning Application 25/P/0530/FUL

Having received a significant number of comments which we consider to be offensive, and which could cause distress, we previously put in place measures to remove from our website all comments sent to us about this application, so they could be reviewed and then published.

Going forward, we will review comments as they are submitted and will only remove those comments which we consider are in breach of the Equality Act 2010, rather than removing all comments as we had previously.
