FAQS ABOUT PARISH COUNCILS

Q: Can residents call for a parish council election?

A: Yes if a casual vacancy arises. If ten electors write to the returning officer within fourteen of the casual vacancy notice being posted an election will be held to fill the vacancy.

It should be noted that the deadlines are tight. It is best to immediately contact the principal authorities monitoring or elections officer to obtain the necessary forms. The 10 electors can comprise husband and wife or partners. It is usually quite easy to obtain the 10 signatures.
