Dear Parishioner

My major concern before the Gypsy Site Meeting was quite simply - would enough people turn up to fill the Hall. I need not have worried, the Coronation Hall was full to overflowing. I do not intend to repeat the points of objection raised at the meeting, but I do feel confident that we shall not now see a site in Bleadon. However, we must not be complacent, we must keep a close watch on this subject at all times until we know for certain that we succeeded. To all who attended the meeting, thank you, in particular I wish to thank Mrs Corder and all Parish Councillors who have worked so very hard to oppose this plan.

I feel sure that you are all aware of the proposed plan, by Wessex Water, to build a Sewage Treatment Works on Bleadon Levels. There is very little that the Parish Council could do to oppose this proposal. We have been in constant correspondence with Wessex Water over the past five months, and have made a number of suggestions about landscaping, etc. Some of our suggestions have been included into their plans. Should approval be given, work will commence in 1992 and continue for 30 months. There will be considerable disruption to Accommodation Road during the period of construction. I do believe that once the work has been completed we shall all rapidly come to accept its presence. Wessex Water have assured us that the finished plant will cause very few, if any, problems for Bleadon.

I reported in the last issue of the Village Newsletter that the planning application for the Honda sign had been refused. The latest news on this is that Honda (UK) Ltd have appealed against the decision to the Department of the Environment. I quote the words of Councillor Strode, "It seems that a company which spends millions of pounds advertising safety has a total disregard for the safety of our Village". I assure you that your Parish Council will do everything in its power to have this appeal rejected.

GUIDE AND SCOUT BUILDING FUND



We have just heard from English Heritage that they agree our proposals for the longoutstanding repair of the chancel and south porch roofs. It is estimated that the work will cost in the region of £100,000 with English Heritage providing 40% after 1st April 1992. In recent years, the PCC has accumulated £30,000 towards this work which means that, in 1992, we must aim to raise £30,000 in addition to the £20,000 pa required simply to "keep the business going".

They also, of course, provide steady extra income for the Coronation Hall.






